

General Rules

- The sponsoring club reserves the right to reject any tractor
- The sponsoring club reserves the right to only run the classes they choose. All classes are club options
- Drivers compete at their own risk and must be 14 years of age or older
- Tractor may not be entered more than one time per class
- Tractors must have hood and grill in its factory location
- Duals, tire chains, and tractors with their 4 wheel drive engaged are not allowed
- Total tractor weight will include driver
- Tractor must make weight **BEFORE** hooking to the sled. There will be no **BEFORE** weight allowance
- Tractor and operator may be requested to reweigh by judge or challenger. Allowance is 1% **AFTER** the pull
- All pullers are responsible for entering into their own and correct classes
- If a tractor pulls less than 30 foot on first attempt, the puller may retry one additional time
- The first puller never has option to repull unless the sled is reset
- Speed limits will be enforced after 100 feet in all classes. Speeding after 100 foot results in disqualification
- Disqualifications result in forfeit of entry fee
- Directing or coaching the driver is prohibited
- Excessive jerking when starting or during the pull is prohibited
- Hitch breakage or loss of any weight results in the pull final distance being taken from that point
- 8 mph speed limit anywhere on grounds. Trucks, cars, tractors, and ATVs all apply
- The contest will be governed by two judges appointed by the sponsoring club. They have final say on all challenges, disputes, and disqualifications. They have the right to stop or disqualify any contestant's tractor that is being operated in an unsafe manner anywhere on the grounds
- Tractors and Drivers are subject to suspension. After two disqualifications that are not track speed in nature, the tractor and/or driver with two disqualifications will be suspended from participation for one calendar year from date of second disqualification. Two suspensions will result in lifetime suspension.
- A tractor's pull is ended by the stop of forward motion, loss of a weight, the tractor going out of bounds, the driver not remaining in the normal driving position, or **speeding past the 100 foot speed pace cone**
- **The sponsoring club has the approval to disqualify future class registrations and keep all sign up moneys and payouts for a puller that refuses to obey the flagman. No tolerance or warnings will be given**

- Random rpm checks for insurance and safety purposes may happen
- No oxygen, ether, propane, alcohol, water, or gassed fuel injection allowed except stock propane tractors

Hitch and Weight Bar

- Hitch may be no closer than 16 inches to the centerline of the tractors rear axle
- Hitch may be no higher than 20 inches off the ground when measured on the scale
- Hitch must be stationary in all 4 directions and must have no more than 1 inch of metal on rear of opening for hook. The sled hook must turn or hang freely in the hitch.
- The tractor rear weight bar must allow easy access to the hitch for the sled operator to hook and unhook the tractor. The hitch hole must be visible from a standing position to the sled personnel that is hooking tractors. There must be a 48" tall by 6" wide empty space from the sled to the tractor hitch for the sled personnel hooking tractor to use as a path to be able to drop the hook with one motion. Tractors failing to meet the rear weight bar requirements will not be allowed to pull with their weight bar on the tractor.
- Rear weights must not extend past 18 inches from the rear radius of the tires
- Front weights must not extend past 11 foot from the center of the rear axle. Tractors may run an oem style front weight bar if the tractor is too long to use front weights and be shorter than 11 foot from the center of the rear axle.

Stock Tractor Classes

- All general rules apply to stock classes
- No sharpened tire lugs are permitted
- Tractors may pull for fun at end of the entered class if they obey the speed and hitch rules. Must pay entry fee.
- Tractors must meet general rules and have max legal tire size or smaller for class entered.
- Tractor @ 8000 pounds and up must meet legal Nebraska Tractor Test horsepower size or smaller for class entered.
- Nebraska tractor test information will be taken from the university of Nebraska website.

- RPMs must be controlled through the factory throttle linkage.
- Tractors @ 8000 pounds and up must have a working PTO shaft or have a factory rear cover that does not have a PTO.
- Tractors must run an engine that is of the manufacturer design block for that tractor
- Tractors must run final drives in the position installed from the manufacturer

Open Tractor Classes

- All general rules apply to open classes
- Tractors may run any size tire. Cut, shaped, and sharpened lugs are allowed.
- Tractors may run any engine that can be cleanly and safely installed into tractor
- Tractors must have wheelie bars to pull in open class. No tolerance
- Tractors must have working kill switch or air shut off. No tolerance
